SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN INSTITUTE FOR COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP PARTNERS

BACKGROUND:

Now in its fourth year, the Institute for Community Leadership is a joint venture of Cumberland County, the City of Fayetteville, Fayetteville State University, Fayetteville Technical Community College, Methodist University, and the Cumberland County School System. The Institute has as its purpose to identify, develop, and empower members of our community who are willing to commit to leadership roles in addressing issues affecting Cumberland County. The goal is to provide community leadership boards, both non-profit and governmental, with applicants who are trained in leadership and knowledgeable of board functions and opportunities for service.

Potential participants are members of our community who are committed to the interests of the community; respected by others and who often influences the opinions of others; that may not have access to this type of training; and who are generally knowledgeable about important issues affecting the community.

Since 2004, ICL has graduated 89 residents of Cumberland County. ICL alumni are currently serving on the Hope Mills Youth Association Board, Fayetteville Observer Credit Union Board, Fayetteville Area Habitat for Humanity Board of Advisors, Administrative Council of Harry Hosier United Methodist Church, Mental Health Board, Human Relations Commission, and the Child Advocacy Center of Cumberland County Board.

RECOMMENDATION/PROPOSED ACTION:

Partners agreed to host the program at their respective organizations for a period of two years every ten years. Cumberland County will host the program June 1, 2015- May 31, 2017. Management recommends approval of the attached Memorandum of Understanding.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN INSTITUTE FOR COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP PARTNERS

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into between Cumberland County, 117 Dick Street, Fayetteville, NC 28301, the City of Fayetteville, 433 Hay Street Fayetteville, NC 28301, Fayetteville State University (FSU), 1200 Murchison Road, Newbold Station, Fayetteville Technical Community College, P.O. Box 35236 Fayetteville, NC 28303, Methodist University, 5400 Ramsey Street Fayetteville, NC 28311, and the Cumberland County School System, 2465 Gillespie Street Fayetteville NC 28306, all referred to below as ICL Partners.

The purpose of this MOU is to solidify the pre-existing partnership and outline the duties and the responsibilities of each partner.

WHEREAS the ICL Partners have a mutual interest in providing community leadership boards, both non-profit and governmental, with applicants who are trained in leadership and cognizant of board functions and opportunities for service and who have not previously taken leadership roles;

NOW THEREFORE the Parties agree as follows:

Article I. SCOPE

It is the understanding of the Parties that the goal of this program is to identify and enroll a minimum of twenty-five and maximum of forty interested citizens, provide at least five, but no more than seven sessions that provide leadership training, introduction to boards and commissions, overview of board/commission members responsibilities, opportunities for networking and presentation of volunteer opportunities. These individuals will have demonstrated leadership ability and interest in the community but have not taken a significant leadership role in any local activity.

Article II. LOCATION

Partners agree to host the program at their respective organizations for a period of two years every ten years. Fayetteville State University will serve as host for the Institute for Community Leadership (ICL) from June 1, 2005-May 31, 2007. The host schedule for the ten-year period beginning June 1, 2007 will be:

June 1, 2007-May 31, 2009	Methodist University
June 1, 2009-May 31, 2011	Fayetteville Technical Community College
June 1, 2011-May 31, 2013	Cumberland County School System
June 1, 2013-May 31, 2015	City of Fayetteville
June 1, 2015-May 31, 2017	Cumberland County
June 1, 2017-May 31, 2019	Fayetteville State University

Article III. ROLES AND RESPONSIBLITIES

- 1. Financial Commitment
 - a. Program funding is a critical issue. This program will continue to be free to participants and each partner shall contribute a minimum of six hundred dollars (\$600) per year to partners. The program's operating budget will be reviewed in April of each year to determine whether there shall be an increase in partner contributions.
 - b. These contributions will be used primarily to pay tuition for students and training session expense for facilitators and program administrators.
 - c. The Executive Director shall present a budget to the ICL Board for approval at the May meeting.
- 2. Program Commitment
 - a. Each partner shall serve as an ambassador for the Institute for Community Leadership.
 - b. **Board Meeting**: Partners agree to host a meeting of the ICL Board approximately twice a year according to an agreed upon rotation. Meetings are typically held the First Tues of a month, from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m., every other month. Responsibilities include:
 - i. chair the meetings
 - ii. publish agenda
 - iii. provide copies of the agenda, minutes of the previous meeting, and other handout
 - iv. provide someone to take minutes, and then distribute the minutes by email to board members
 - v. ensure parking is reserved for attendees.
 - vi. provide light refreshments.
 - c. Each partner shall appoint at least one (1) representative to serve on the ICL Board. Each partner shall identify one (1) alternate with decision-making authority who may attend ICL Board meetings in their absence.
 - d. Each partner shall attend (or send a representative) to each ICL Board Meeting.
 - e. Each partner shall nominate participants and submit those nominations in writing to the Executive Director by June 30, 2006.
 - f. Sessions: Each partner shall sponsor one program session per the schedule drafted by the Executive Director and approved by the ICL Board. Partner responsibilities associated with the program sessions are:
 - i. Provide an administrative contact to handle session logistics, including but not limited to securing a location, providing refreshments, identifying and confirming presenters, panelists and trainers, participant attendance and distribution and collection of evaluations. This contact will be responsible for providing to the Executive Director the attendance sheet and evaluation no later than seven (7) days following the session.
 - ii. Provide the Executive Director materials listed in "Participant Notebook Contents" by August 31.

- iii. Provide an agenda and copies of handouts/materials related to the agenda at least three weeks (21 working days) before the scheduled session.
- 3. Administration
 - a. The host organization shall administer the Institute for Community Leadership by providing the following:
 - i. Staff support to serve as Executive Director
 - ii. Office space
 - iii. Marketing
 - iv. Graduation certificates
 - v. Leadership self-assessments
 - vi. Miscellaneous supplies
 - b. Methodist University shall handle budget reconciliation and collection of partner contributions.

Article IV. Effective date of agreement

This MOU is effective upon signature of the parties and will remain in effect unless and until terminated as provided under Article VI.

Article V. Purpose or intent of parties entering the MOU

The purpose of the memorandum is to provide a general understanding and agreement that all parties are intent upon providing a well-run and supported program to address the need for leadership in our community.

Article VI. Term of agreement

This MOU is effective upon signature of the parties and will remain in effect for a period of twelve (12) months from the effective date or unless terminated as provided under Article IX or unless superseded by the execution of a contract by the parties that is related to this MOU.

Article VII. Severability clause (if applicable)

Nothing in this MOU is intended to conflict with the current laws, regulations, or directives of the state of North Carolina or the University of North Carolina System. If an article of this MOU is inconsistent with such authority, then that term shall be invalid, but the remaining terms and conditions of this MOU shall remain in full force and effect.

Annually, the Department of Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention provides funding to local county governments for the purpose of funding early intervention programs/services for youth that are involved in, or may become involved in, the juvenile court system.

After consideration of the 2007-2008 Department of Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention's (DJJDP) projected allocations for local JCPC's, during our May meeting, held on Wednesday, May 9, 2007 regarding funding for the next fiscal year, the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has completed their annual planning process. As part of that meeting, the JCPC voted unanimously to submit the council's funding recommendations and the 2007-2008 annual Comprehensive Planning document for Cumberland County and the DJJDP state program agreements for seven local programs.

Cumberland County is projected to receive \$940,867 in state dollars for fiscal year 2007-2008. Local matching funds are required in order to be eligible to receive these state funds. During the past, the County of Cumberland has generously contributed a portion of the required match. During the 2006-2007 fiscal year, the County of Cumberland provided the JCPC \$211,684 to support the programs funded by the JCPC. The local council gratefully acknowledges the ongoing support provided by the county.

This packet represents the funding recommendations the CCJCPC is making to the C.C. Board of Commissioners for their consideration during the May 21, 2007 meeting. The projected 2007-2008 funding plan is attached for review. Please feel free to contact me should you have any questions or require further assistance.

SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT IN KAGAN V. MOSLEY

BACKGROUND: The Board of Commissioners has authorized settlement of this action. This lawsuit was filed by Plaintiff Kagan against, among others, the Sheriff's Office and Deputy L. Christian, alleging failure of a state law duty to provide adequate medical care to the plaintiff when he was detained in the Cumberland County Detention Center. Plaintiff was removed from a Greyhound bus traveling from New York City to Miami by the Fayetteville City Police at the request of personnel in Greyhound's Fayetteville bus terminal, who alleged he was either drunk or otherwise acting in a disruptive manner. While being removed from the bus and placed in a Fayetteville Police department vehicle, Plaintiff scuffled with the officer and fell over a curb while handcuffed. Plaintiff was processed that night into the Cumberland County Detention Center. In the morning, he requested medical care and was referred to Highsmith Rainey Hospital, where it was determined that, among other injuries, he had a broken collar bone. While the Sheriff's Office vigorously denies that it has any legal liability to the Plaintiff, the costs of continued defense of this action would likely exceed \$75,000 while any conceivable recovery against the Sheriff's Office would, because of the defense of sovereign immunity, be limited to the amount of the Sheriff's bond, \$25,000. The Plaintiff has agreed to settle for Twenty Five Thousand (\$25,000) Dollars. The costs associated with continued defense of this action would substantially exceed that amount. Plaintiff and his counsel have now signed the settlement agreement and Plaintiff has signed a comprehensive release and waiver of all claims.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: File this memorandum with the minutes of this meeting as a record of settlement; authorize payment of \$25,000 in settlement of all claims and in exchange for a release of all claims against the County, the Sheriff's Office, and their personnel; and authorize the County Attorney to sign the settlement agreement, with no admission of liability.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT, made and entered into this the /9 day of Apri/, 2007 by and between DAVID KAGAN (hereinafter PLAINTIFF) and the COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND and being made for the benefit of the following third-party beneficiaries of such agreement, including, EARL R. BUTLER, in his official capacity as Sheriff of Cumberland County, North Carolina, L.A. CHRISTIAN, individually, and in her official capacity as a Deputy Sheriff for Cumberland County, North Carolina, and WESTERN SURETY COMPANY, in its capacity as surety for the said Earl R. Butler (hereinafter referred to as "RELEASED PARTIES"):

WITNESSETH

THAT WHEREAS, the parties to this Settlement Agreement are the PLAINTIFF and the County of Cumberland for the benefit of itself and three third-party beneficiaries, being three of the named Defendants in that civil action currently pending before the United States District Court for the Eastern District of North Carolina, Western Division, captioned: <u>DAVID KAGAN</u>, <u>PLAINTIFF v S.C. MOSLEY</u>, individually and in his official capacity, <u>CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE</u>, NORTH CAROLINA, a municipal corporation, EARL R. BUTLER, <u>SHERIFF OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY</u>, in his official capacity, L.A. CHRISTIAN, individually, and in her official capacity, WESTERN SURETY COMPANY, and <u>GREYHOUND LINES</u>, INC., a wholly owned subsidiary of LAIDLAW INTERNATIONAL, INC., DEFENDANTS, bearing file number 5:06CV 170-BR (hereinafter CIVIL ACTION); and

WHEREAS, PLAINTIFF and the RELEASED PARTIES have agreed to a settlement of the PLAINTIFF's claims against the RELEASED PARTIES only, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the promises and obligations hereinafter made and undertaken, **PLAINTIFF** and the **RELEASED PARTIES** agree as follows:

- Upon the execution of this agreement the RELEASED PARTIES shall pay, or cause to be paid, to the PLAINTIFF the sum of TWENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000.00). This sum shall be delivered and made payable to: <u>Law</u> <u>Offices of Dale S. Morrison (Attorney for David Kagan), 4601 Park Road, Suite</u> <u>620, Charlotte, NC 28209</u>. That upon the delivery of the \$25,000.00 sum, PLAINTIFF shall execute and deliver to the RELEASED PARTIES, a Limited Release in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 2. Upon the entry of a Protective Order in regard to Discovery in the CIVIL ACTION, the RELEASED PARTIES shall timely and fully comply and deliver to PLAINTIFF'S counsel each of their Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, Rule 26(a) discovery disclosures and all discovery requests previously propounded by the PLAINTIFF to the RELEASED PARTIES in the CIVIL ACTION within fifteen (15) days. That such compliance by the RELEASED PARTIES shall be subject to the provisions of Rule 37 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. PLAINTIFF and his counsel shall abide fully and completely by the terms of the protective order concerning the confidentiality, nondisclosure or restriction of the

RELEASED PARTIES' documents which may be subject to such protective order. Counsel for the **RELEASED PARTIES** shall promptly terminate and cancel all pending or ongoing discovery sought from **PLAINTIFF** which discovery was instituted by or on behalf of any of the **RELEASED PARTIES** except that with respect to the pending notices of deposition and subpoenas, if the remaining defendants wish to proceed then the parties shall proceed with the taking of the depositions without changing dates or times.

- 3. Upon compliance by the **RELEASED PARTIES** with the requirements of Paragraphs 1 and 2 above, the **PLAINTIFF** through counsel shall enter and file a voluntary dismissal *with prejudice* of **PLAINTIFF's** claims against the **RELEASED PARTIES** only, in the CIVIL ACTION. Each party (**PLAINTIFF** and **RELEASED PARTIES**) shall bear his, her or its respective costs and attorneys fees. To the extent that a court order is required to dismiss the **RELEASED PARTIES** from the CIVIL ACTION, **PLAINTIFF'S** counsel and the **RELEASED PARTIES** from the CIVIL ACTION, **PLAINTIFF'S** counsel and the **RELEASED PARTIES** counsel shall cooperate in both a timely and good faith manner to obtain and effect such order. Nothing within this Settlement Agreement shall be construed as creating a right, defense, bar, remedy or other claim or action by those Defendants in the CIVIL ACTION who are not **RELEASED PARTIES** denominated under this Settlement Agreement.
- 4. The **RELEASED PARTIES** shall, subject to subpoen issued to their counsel of record in this action, make themselves, their employees and officers reasonably available to provide testimonial evidence in the CIVIL ACTION whether by deposition, testimony at trial, or both.
- 5. The **RELEASED PARTIES** warrant to the **PLAINTIFF** that they stand by, and will stand by, the denials contained in their answers to the **PLAINTIFF'S** complaint in the CIVIL ACTION; that such denials are of the material allegations of the paragraphs of the complaint to which such denials are addressed; and that such denials do not contain negative pregnants and are not otherwise evasive or misleading.
- 6. The **RELEASED PARTIES** warrant to the **PLAINTIFF** that the sums being paid pursuant to Paragraph 1 above represent the limits of liability of all bonds, insurance policies or other coverages available to cover the liability of any of the **RELEASED PARTIES** on the claims asserted by the **PLAINTIFF** in the CIVIL ACTION.
- 7. The **RELEASED PARTIES** warrant to the **PLAINTIFF** that they have made no agreements that would hinder, impair or delay the **PLAINTIFF'S** ability to pursue his claims against the other Defendants in the CIVIL ACTION or his ability to collect on any judgment he may recover against any of such other Defendants.

The foregoing contains the entire agreement between the parties, and no modification hereof shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the **PLAINTIFF** and such of the **RELEASED PARTIES** as may be affected by such modification.

The parties to this agreement represent by their signatures below that they have had full and timely opportunity to consult and discuss the terms of this Settlement Agreement with their respective counsel of record in the CIVIL ACTION. The parties represent by their signatures below that they enter this Settlement Agreement freely and voluntarily and have the requisite authority and approval to execute same.


Tammy Barry spoke in rebuttal and stated that she was aware of drainage and runoff concerns and that those issues would be addressed during development.

The developer should contact E911 Street Naming/Signs for inquiries regarding the County's policy for street sign installation or, if the sign is commissioned from a private source, to schedule an inspection of the street sign(s). Land Use Codes must receive notice of agreement with the Street Naming & Addressing Section for sign installation or of satisfactory inspection prior to the approval of the final plat.
- 18. The developer is to contact E911 Street Naming and Addressing regarding the process of acquiring "approved" street names and the approved street names must be reflected on the final plat when any portion of this development is submitted for final approval. (Note: Street name approval can take up to ten working days.)
- 19. The builder/developer shall provide the buildable envelopes on the final plat: providing a five-foot maintenance easement along each side of all common internal lines with all other applicable setbacks being provided for, <u>or</u> at the time of permit application, the individual plot plans for each individual residential lot must be approved by Land Use Codes prior to issuance of any permits.
- 20. Any/All easements shall be reflected on the final plat and labeled as to type of easement, reference number for document creating the easement, and the name of the agency, individual, etc. who holds the easement.
- 21. The developer shall provide for an inspection of the private street(s) by a registered engineer or registered surveyor upon completion of construction of the private street(s) and related facilities, including drainage ways. A statement, affixed with the engineer/surveyor's seal, certifying that all private street(s) and related facilities are designed and constructed in accordance with the requirements of Section 4.2, County Subdivision Ordinance, and that all such facilities are adequate to serve the development, must be submitted to Land Use Codes prior to final plat approval or release of any construction guarantees as allowed under Section 2.6, County Subdivision Ordinance.
- 22. A 25' right-of-way radius is required at all intersections and must be reflected on the final plat.
- 23. The notarized signature(s) of all current tax record owner(s) and notary certifications appear on the final plat when submitted for final approval.
- 24. The developer is reminded that the improvements must be in place or that final plat approval will only be granted in accordance with Section 2.6 b, c, or d, County Subdivision Ordinance. (Note: Once the improvements are in place, the developer is responsible for contacting Peggy Jennings to schedule an inspection of the improvements.)

25. The final plat must be submitted to Land Use Codes for review and approval for recording with the County Register of Deeds, and the plat must be recorded prior to any permit application for any structure and/or prior to the sale of any lot or unit within this development.

Plat-Required Statements:

26. Since this development is located within the Farmland Protection Area as defined on the current Land Use Plan map, the following disclosure statement shall be provided on the final plat:

"This property or neighboring property may be subject to inconvenience, discomfort, and the possibility of injury to property and health arising from normal and accepted farming and agricultural practices and operations, including but not limited to noise, odors, dust, the operation of any kind of machinery the storage and disposal of manure, and the application of fertilizers, soil amendments, herbicides, and pesticides."

27. The final plat shall reflect the following statements required for the private street(s):

"No public agency is presently responsible for maintenance of the private street(s) shown on this plat. Private streets are for the use of all owners of property within this development and their guests; and any governmental agency or personnel or equipment thereof who shall be granted perpetual access over all such private streets to accomplish or fulfill any service or function for which the agency is responsible and that any agency or organization designated by a governmental agency to perform a designated function shall also retain access the same as any government agency. Any governmental agency exercising its access rights shall have the same rights and only such liabilities as it would have on any public lands, rights-of-way, or easements."

28. If it is determined that public water and/or sewer is not available and private well(s) and/or septic tank(s) are used to serve this development, the following statement must be reflected on the final plat:

"The individual lots in this development do not have public sewer and/or water services available, and no lots have been approved by the Health Department for on-site sewer services or been deemed acceptable for private wells at the date of this recording."

29. The all structures shall be shown on the final plat or the final plat shall reflect the following statement:

"Nonconforming structures have not been created by this subdivision."

Other Relevant Conditions:

30. The owner/developer be aware that every deed created for the purpose of conveying a lot served by a private street must contain the following disclosure statement at the time of recordation with the County Register of Deeds:

"It is hereby acknowledged that a subdivision streets disclosure statement has been executed in accordance with N.C.G.S 136-102.6(f)."

31. The owner/developer be aware that every deed created for a lot being served by an on-site water and/or sewer system must contain the following disclosure when filed with the County Register of Deeds: "Public water and/or sewer services are not available as of the date of the recording of this deed. On-site sewer disposal systems must be approved by the County Health Department."

MINUTES OF MARCH 20, 2007

Mr. Lloyd presented the case information and stated that staff had reviewed this case on January 8, 2007 and recommended denial of the R15/Density Development/Conditional Use District and Permit. Rather than present this recommendation to the Board and in order to give the applicant an opportunity to correct what the Staff found to be deficiencies in the application and the site plan, the Staff requested a deferral for this case at the January 16. 2007 Board meeting. The applicant subsequently revised the application and the site plan with the request remaining R15/DD/CUD&P. Staff met again on this request, reviewing the revised application and site plan. and recommends denial of the R15/Density Development/Conditional Use District based on the findings that: the district requested is inconsistent with the 2010 Land Use Plan which calls for "farmland" at this location; the request, qualifying as unreasonable, is not in character with the lot sizes of the surrounding properties and would not be in harmony with the surrounding land uses since the subject property is located within an area that consists primarily of A1 Agricultural zoning with relatively small areas of RR Rural Residential and R40 Residential zoning districts: and favorable consideration of this request for this area is arbitrary and would not serve a viable public interest when the current state of the right-of-way is taken into consideration. Old Vander Road is a "minor thoroughfare", in which severe congestion exists, qualifying this request as unreasonable. In addition to the existing school traffic, a 230 lot subdivision with direct access to Old Vander Road was approved as a "use by right" in March 2006. Staff also recommends denial of the Conditional Use Permit based on the findings that the proposed development of 102 lots at this location is not in the public interest because of the state of Old Vander Road as previously noted: the extension of utilities being highly improbable at this location since the closest public water and sewer lines available for extension are North of the railroad tracks serving the previously mentioned development of 230 lots are north of the railroad track; there is a substantial portion of hydric soils on the subject property; and the degree of difference in the surrounding land uses and lot sizes compared to the proposed lots shown on the site plan is such that this request qualifies as being unreasonable. A possible suitable zoning district that could be considered for this request would be a R40/Density Development/Conditional Use District and Permit.

MINUTES OF APRIL 17, 2007:

The Staff recommended approval of the R40/Density Development/Conditional Use District based on the following:

- 1. The request is reasonable and consistent with the existing lot sizes, zoning and land uses within the general area; and
- The request is consistent with the 2010 Land Use Plan which calls for "farmland" at this location. Note: The 2010 LUP finds the R40 zoning district to be suitable in areas designated for "farmland".

The Staff recommended approval of the Conditional Use Permit based on:

- 1. The use will not materially endanger the public health or safety if located according to the plan submitted and recommended the site plan as submitted meets or exceeds the minimum development standards for subdivisions within the County, as well as complying with the criteria established in Article VIII of the County Ordinance, the adopted minimum submission criteria for approval of a Density Development.
- 2. The use meets all required conditions and specifications the owner's written confirmation of her agreement with the Ordinance Related Conditions is attached;

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- 3. The use will maintain or enhance the value of adjoining or abutting properties the developer is aggressively pursuing the extension of public water and sewer to the site, working in conjunction with the Public Works Commission and the applicant is proposing a quality development that should aid in the enhancement of the property values within the area;
- 4. The location and character of the use, if developed according to the plan as submitted and recommended, will be in harmony with the area in which it is to be located and in general conformity with Cumberland County's most recent Land Use Plan and adopted planning policies – as stated above, the request is consistent with the Land Use Plan and is also within keeping of the character of the general area.

A motion was made by Mrs. Piland and seconded by Vice-Chair McLaurin to follow the staff recommendations and approve R40/Density Development/Conditional Use District because the application is reasonable, neither arbitrary nor unduly discriminatory and in the public interest. The motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Mrs. Piland and seconded by Vice-Chair McLaurin to approve the Conditional Use Permit after finding that when completed, the proposal: 1) will not materially endanger the public health and safety; 2) will not substantially injure the value of adjoining or abutting property; 3) will be in harmony with the area in which it is to be located; and 4) will be conformity with the land use plan, thoroughfare plan or other plan officially adopted by the Board of Commissioners. The motion passed unanimously.





SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION OF JOINT PLANNING BOARD REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TERM OF CLIFTON MCNEILL, JR.

BACKGROUND: The Joint Planning Board voted unanimously at its meeting of May 15, 2007 respectfully to request that the Board of Commissioners consider extending the term of Clifton McNeill, Jr. for an additional year. Mr. McNeill will complete his second term on the Joint Planning Board this coming June 30, 2007. The Joint Planning Board notes that Mr. McNeill is a co-chair of the 2030 Plan Task Force and a representative of the Joint Planning Board on that body. The Joint Planning Board believes that his continued service in bringing the 2030 Plan to approval and in its initial implementation would be highly desirable and beneficial to the County. The Joint Planning Board also notes that Mr. McNeill is a member of its Land Use Codes Subcommittee, which is engaged in a thorough-going review and revision of the Subdivision Ordinance this year, and that his expertise, experience on the Board, and judgment will be invaluable in that process also.

Mr. McNeill has served as Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson of the Joint Planning Board and also has Chairperson of its Land Use Codes Subcommittee.
